* The University of Georgia (USA) seeks to fill a full-time, tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor rank in the area of children's physical activity, fitness, and school health promotion for an appointment that begins in August, 2015. The successful candidate would have a (a) Doctorate in Kinesiology or closely related field (e.g., Sport Pedagogy, Teacher Education, or School Health), and (b) evidence of successful research, teaching, and potential for securing external funding. Responsibilities of the position include: (a) the teaching of undergraduate and graduate courses in the area of physical education, with a specific expertise in children's physical activity for health and well-being, (b) e a focused line of research in children's physical activity for health and well-being involving undergraduate and graduate students, (c) seeking external funding for research projects and educational programs, (d) advising graduate students, and direct master's and doctoral students' thesis and dissertation research, and (e) participating in the development of the health and physical education teacher education programs and serve on department, college, and university committees.

* Applications are invited for a PhD studentship in the School of Sport, Exercise & Health Sciences, Loughborough University, commencing January 2015. The topic of interest is in *"Pedagogy of technology in physical education: Possibility or fallacy?"* Drawing on innovative technologies and working with practitioners this studentship will examine both the many outstanding examples of how teachers have integrated technology into their lessons, and the barriers to its use that some teachers experience or perceive. The aim is to better understand what might be achieved through the use of technology in the day-to-day realities of teaching physical education. Applicants should have a good first degree in Physical Education, Sport Studies, Sport and Exercise Science (with a significant pedagogical component), or a related discipline. A Master's degree in one of these areas is desirable. Applicants should be competent in quantitative and qualitative research methods, possess strong communication skills (both oral and written), and demonstrate a broad range of IT-related abilities. The studentship provides a stipend of £13,863 per annum plus tuition fees at the UK/EU rate for up to three years.
