\* The 2017 **AIESEP** World Conference will be held November 7-10, 2017 in Pointe'à'Pitre, Guadeloupe (FRA) hosted by the Université des Antilles. The theme of the Conference is "Cultures, Disciplines, Interactions: Contextualizing Diversity in Physical Activities and Physical Education" with sub-themes of: (a) Diversity in Physical Education and Sport: Opportunities and Challenges for Sport Pedagogy, (b) Learner Identities within Physical Education and Sport: Overtaking Inequities, (c) Cultural Competencies in Teacher and Coach Education, and (d) Inclusion Policies in Physical Education and Sport Practices.

\* **AIESEP** is scheduled to hold two research symposia at *ICSEMIS 2016* in Santos (BRA), August 31-September 4. One symposium, chaired by **AIESEP** Board Member, Attilio Carraro, is "Values-Based Education Through Sport and Physical Education: Myths and Realities." The other symposium, chaired by **AIESEP** Secretary General, Mary O'Sullivan, is "Quality Teacher Education: Global Challenges for Quality Physical Education." \* During the recent *AIESEP* World Conference in Laramie (June 2016), the newly-formed AIESEP SIG for early years organized a one-day, pre-congress seminar. This provided a forum for sharing information relating to multicultural aspects and experiences within research undertaken in various early years contexts. Specifically: Len Almond (UK) presented the concept of purposeful play; Debra Vinci and her colleagues (USA) presented research from an intervention involving early educators; Arja Sääkslahti (FIN) instigated discussion around the Scandinavian day care ideology, following Ingunn Fjortoft's (NOR) presentation of affordances in outdoor experiences for young children; Boris Jidovtseff (BEL) described some excellent examples of how to modify indoor facilities for young children; Mary Vandermeulen (BEL) spoke about the water environment and early years; and Christine De Martelaer (BEL) talked about safety issues in water activities for young children. Approximately 25 participants took part in what was a very intensive program, including in-depth discussions around each of the topics noted above. The meeting identified many issues for future discussions. Importantly, it highlighted that there is a pressing need for consensus with regard to the terminology used to describe young children's physical activity, play and educational provision, as well as an agreement on the age range of children within 'early years' contexts in different cultures. In terms of future activities, the AIESEP SIG for early

years will be involved in the CIAPSE 2 (Children's Physical Activity and Sport 2) congress in Jyväskylä (FIN) January 26-28, 2017. The SIG will organize a thematic symposium as a part of this congress, the title of which will be "PE in the Early Years: What are the guidelines, curriculum and practices?". Required Qualifications: an earned doctorate (Ph.D. or equivalent) in biomechanics or a closely related field of research by August 2017, author or co-author of high quality biomechanics research published in peer-reviewed academic journals. Preferred qualifications: post-doctoral experience (or equivalent) of at least one year, experience teaching at least one human movement biomechanics course, received external funding for research or submitted at least one grant application aimed at obtaining external funding for research, or musculoskeletal modelling expertise.
