\* The *Sport for Development* sector project (GER) is seeking to fill an Advisor (f/m) position. The Sport for Development sector project is part of the Education, Health and Social Protection division's Competence Centre for Education. The project is implemented by GIZ on behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and will run until the end of 2015. Its core tasks include advisory services to BMZ, coordinating the relevant German actors, and initiating and implementing pilot programs in several countries on various continents.
