\* On October 17-18, 2014, the University of Liege, Belgium, will organize the <u>International Congress</u> on <u>Children's Physical Activity and Sport</u>. This event is considered the 2<sup>nd</sup> European congress on physical activity and health among children. Reflections and discussions will focus on the key period between three and nine years, when children start to take part in organized physical and sporting activities. This is a crucial age range because this is when relevant and appropriate practice can establish the solid foundations which children need to encourage them to take pleasure in sport and to practice physical activity in the long term. This congress is a unique opportunity to meet international experts and to share your knowledge, experience and skills through oral presentations, posters and videos. Three major questions will be addressed throughout the congress: (1) How important is physical activity during childhood for encouraging a lifetime of physical activity or sport? (2) What factors encourage or discourage children's physical activity and their future involvement in sport? (3) What type of activity should children undertake and how can long-term involvement be encouraged? Abstracts of papers from the congress will be published in a special edition of 'Science & Sports' (IF = .49).
