We seek an individual with outstanding accomplishments for research in the area of movement impairments in children/adolescents with neurodevelopmental disabilities. The successful candidate will provide leadership in the Department of Kinesiology and beyond through outstanding accomplishments and future capacity in research on motor development in children's disabilities. It is expected that the individual appointed will maintain an ambitious research and development agenda appropriate to his or her interests, including developing proposals for external funding, overseeing project development and implementation, disseminating research through scholarly writing and presentations, mentoring graduate students, and collaborating with faculty on research activities related to the mission of the Department of Kinesiology

- * The Journal of Sports Sciences has experienced unprecedented growth over recent years. The journal now publishes 24 issues per annum, and 1640 new articles have been submitted for publication consideration already this calendar year. Moreover, while the quantity of published papers has grown markedly, the impact factor (IF) of the journal has continued to rise, thanks to the efforts of its Editorial Board, Advisory Board and volunteer reviewers. The journal currently ranks 22/82 publications with an IF of 2.142. A challenge that has arisen with this growth is the significant increase in workload for the Editorial Board. Currently, the journal has 12 Section Editors, each with a different area of specialisation. The plan is to collapse these 12 Sections into 5 new Sections, each led by an Executive Editor and supported by at least 3 Associate Editors. The overall result will be an increase in the number of Editorial Board members from 12 to at least 20. The revised structure will also provide a convenient way to increase the number of Editorial Board members associated with each Section in future, thereby providing a structure that is flexible to deal with further increases in submission numbers. The 5 new Sections are: 1. Behavioural and Social Sciences (BSS) a merger of psychology, motor behaviour and expert performance, as well as encouraging more submissions with a social sciences emphasis; 2. Biological Sciences (BS) a merger of physiology, nutrition and biochemistry, kinanthropometry and body composition; 3. Sports Medicine and Biomechanics (SMB) a merger of these two areas; 4. Physical Activity, Health and Exercise (PAHE) a multi-disciplinary section; 5. Sports Performance (SP) a multi-disciplinary area which

involves a merger of match analysis, talent identification and coaching science. These Sections will be led by the following Executive Editors, all of whom are current Editorial Board members: Andy Lane (A.M.Lane2@wlv.ac.uk; BSS); Gareth Davison (gw.davison@ulster.ac.uk; BS); Eric Wallace (es.wallace@ulster.ac.uk; SMB); Colin Boreham (Colin.Boreham@ucd.ie; PAHE); and Grant Abt (G.Abt@hull.ac.uk; SP). The journal is now looking to appoint a number of new Associate Editors to work with these Executive Editors. The Associate Editors are expected to manage the review process for around 60-80 papers per annum, and to attend one Section meeting and one Editorial Board meeting per annum. A stipend will be paid to each Associate Editor in the form of editorial expenses. An expression of interest in regards to taking up the role of Associate Editor should be made directly to the relevant Executive Editor or to the Editor-in-Chief. Please include a short (maximum 2-page) statement highlighting why you are interested in taking on this role, and a Curriculum Vitae. We would be happy to consider expressions of interest from UK and non-UK based candidates. The deadline for submission is December 1st, 2016. The appointments will commence in January 2017 and will be for a three-year period in the first instance.
