The importance of physical activity during early years has been recently recognized in Finland and confirms the interest that AIESEP provided to the creation of an Early Years Special Interest Group (EY-SIG). Indeed, Prof. Arja Sääkslahti, the chair of this SIG, has been elected to the Board of the Finnish Olympic Committee. She is expected to be the voice of (young) children, underlining the priority given by this pioneer country in identifying how physical activity contributes to the child's physical, psychological, cognitive and social well-being.
